



Well here it is four months later and I am now getting around to writing the next part of the journal. As you may have guessed from the header photo I have been playing with night photography. This can be a very satisfying or frustrating exercise. Noise in the image is the major problem. A 30 second exposure using an ISO of up to 5000 can become very noisy or grainy. Then of course there can be some wonderful coincidences, like the meteor in the above photo.





The other interesting aspect of this photography is recording the path of the satellites that are visible in the early evening. The first photo indicates the travel of a satellite in 30 seconds. The second photo records two satellites in the one image.



It is very obvious where my main interest is with my photography. I have spent a number of evenings being eaten by mosquitoes and watching out for snakes and crocodiles. But it has been a lot of fun and I am reasonably happy with the results.

My second area of interest is dramatic weather and I am also happy with the results I achieved of storm clouds off Wonger Beach.

And just to prove I am not a one or two trick pony I have added a freeze-frame from one of my drone videos. The drone is becoming easier to fly and when I get the camera to work reliably I should have enough material for another part of the journal.
